

## Medi-Cal

### Eligibility

- Children under 21
- Adults who are 65+, legally blind or disabled, or caretakers that have deprived children under 21 living in the home
- Adults 21-65 living in a Long Term Care Facility
- Pregnant women

\*Note: Undocumented women are eligible

**Cost:** Varies depending on income

**Qualifying Income:** up to 100% FPL for adults; up to 250% FPL for children and 200% FPL for pregnant women

## Access for Infants & Mothers (AIM)

### Eligibility

Women who:

- Are not more than 30 weeks pregnant and are a CA Resident
- Do not have no-cost Medi-Cal, Medicare, or insurance coverage for pregnancy, or have deductibles/co-pays for maternity over \$500
- Meet monthly household income guidelines

**Cost:** For pregnancy/first 60 days after, 1.5% adjusted household income after deductions

**Qualifying Income:** between 200-300% FPL

## Family PACT

### Eligibility

Those who meet income guidelines and:

- Don't have insurance that covers family planning
- Have insurance but need family planning services kept confidential or have not met the deductible/Medi-Cal Share of Cost
- Have Medi-Cal coverage that doesn't include family planning

**Cost:** There is *no cost* for Family PACT

**Qualifying Income:** up to 200% FPL

## Every Woman Counts

### Eligibility

- Are 40+ and live in California
- Have medical insurance that doesn't cover these services or have a high deductible or co-payment
- Are not getting these services through any government-sponsored programs

**Cost:** *Free* breast exam and mammogram, if eligible

**Qualifying Income:** up to 200% FPL

## Healthy Kids (Solano)

### Eligibility

- Children under the age of 19
- Must reside in Solano county
- Has not had employer-sponsored health care coverage in the last 3 months
- Is not eligible for Medi-Cal

**Cost:** Families will be charged a monthly premium based on family size and income; not to exceed \$45 per month

**Qualifying Income:** up to 300% FPL

## Low Income Health Program (LIHP)

### Eligibility \*varies by county

- U.S. Citizen/legal permanent residents who have resided in U.S. continuously for 5 years
- **Contra Costa:**  
HCCI/MCE: 19-64 years old
- **Solano:**  
PATH 2 HEALTH: 21-64 years old

**Cost:** Varies by county

**Qualifying Income:** varies by county

## CMSP (Solano)

### Eligibility

- Applicants must reside in Solano county
- Applicants must be between ages 21-64
- Applicant must be a U.S. citizen or resident

**Cost:** Varies depending on income

**Qualifying Income:** up to 200% FPL

## Basic Health Care (Contra Costa)

### Eligibility

- Legal permanent residents who reside in Contra Costa County
- May not be eligible for Medi-Cal and are not a member of private HMO or PPO health plans

\*NOTE: Children under the age of 19, regardless of immigrant legal status, may apply

**Cost:** \$0-225 every 3 months for adults; \$0-\$15 every 3 months for children under age 19

**Qualifying Income:** up to 300% FPL

Required Documents

- **Proof of Income**  
Ex: Most recent paycheck stub, or unemployment benefits statement
- **Proof of California Residency**  
Ex: Utility receipts in your name, or car registration in your name
- **Identification**  
Ex: California Driver's License
- **Verification of Legal Status**  
Ex: Birth Certificate, Passport, or Naturalization Certificate
